(2) NATURE AND/OR DESCRIPTION OF ACTION BEING APPROVED:

Reference laboratory services. Services include pickup and transport specimens to the contractor's laboratory and perform the following: preanalytic processing; analysis, reporting of analytic results directly into the VA's Computerized Patient Record System (CPRS) and consultation regarding selection, collection, transportation and results interpretation.

(3) (a) A DESCRIPTION OF THE SUPPLIES OR SERVICES REQUIRED TO MEET THE AGENCY'S NEED:

The VA Sierra Nevada Health Care System (VASNHCS) requires a reference lab testing services for tests that cannot be performed on-site. The reference laboratory must be able to provide an electronic computer interface to send lab orders to the testing facility and to receive results automatically in the VA Sierra Nevada Health Care System Computerized Patient Record System (CPRS).

Quest Diagnostics Inc. has provided an electronic interface capability (bi-directional) system (EFC-bd) which is housed at the VA Palo Alto Health Care System. This allows electronic order entry, inquiry, test status, results, test methodologies, etc. Each laboratory in VISN 21 has a Quest interface software program that connects through the EFC-bd that acts as a host to host connection. This allows for interfacing between Quest Diagnostics and all laboratories in VISN 21. The EFC-bd is based on Health Level System (HL 7) Version 2.3 messaging protocol and the Veterans Health Information Systems and Technology Architecture (Vista) interchange. The interface allows VA laboratory personnel to construct shipping lists using VISTA that includes specimens, tests ordered and other information to identify the shipment before Quest physically receives it. This allows for tracking of all specimens that are shipped and gives data as to why a specimen was not received at Quest. When Quest completes testing the interface allows for automatic release or for review before release of the results depending on the lab's preference. In case of a computer outage, Quest has a contingency plan in place to provide hard copies of patient results to the ordering facility.

(5) DESCRIBE WHY YOU BELIEVE THE ORDER REPRESENTS THE BEST VALUE CONSISTENT WITH FAR 8.4 TO AID THE CONTRACTING OFFICER IN MAKING THIS BEST VALUE DETERMINATION:

The interface provided by Quest Diagnostics provides many benefits, including:

- Patient Safety Standard (Joint Commission Laboratory Patient Safety Standards IM: Interfaced functionality is preferred whenever possible; this will reduce the patient safety risk from both clerical errors introduced with the data is manually entered and through misplaced reports. With the electronic interface there is little chance that the paper reports will end up in the wrong hands, further protecting patient data.
- Real time results: The results are available to providers in CPRS as soon as they are complete; there is no wait time for VA staff to enter the results in CPRS.
- Error reduction (lab orders and veteran test results were being manually entered in CPRS)
- Wasted resources reduction: There are no printed copies to handle/account for, enter into CPRS and shred.

(6) DESCRIBE THE MARKET RESEARCH CONDUCTED AMONG SCHEDULE HOLDERS AND THE RESULTS OR A STATEMENT OF THE REASON MARKET RESEARCH WAS NOT CONDUCTED:

A Sources Sought was posted to GSA eBuy from 08/20/2015 to 08/26/2015. All of the schedule holders under SIN 621-200 through 621-212 were invited to respond with their capability to provide the same interface. A total of 3 responses were received; Cedar Diagnostics, LLC, Laboratory Corporation of America and Quest Diagnostics. Quest Diagnostics is currently the only laboratory with an operable interface capable of providing electronic test ordering and results delivery that allows healthcare providers to view test results in CPRS at the VA Sierra Nevada Health Care System.


