B.4 FUNCTIONAL PERFORMANCE SPECIFICATION

Operating Room (OR) Cabinet Doors

Description

VA-CIHCS has a requirement for the materials, fabrication, and installation of custom doors for 12 built-in cabinets located in sterile Surgical Services Operating Rooms. Doors will be two full height stainless steel piano hinged panel doors with large tempered glass panel fronts. The doors will have handles for opening and commercial grade locks installed. The proposal will include six (6) high capacity stainless steel shelves for each cabinet that can be adjustable to hold reusable medical equipment and adjustment brackets to fit bracket holes already in place. Eighteen (18) gauge, 316 Stainless-steel fabricated in a carbon-free environment will be used for both doors and shelving. **Site visits are HIGHLY encouraged** in order to ensure precise measurements for a perfect fit to the existing cabinets. The finished product will have a clean and professional look, allow for easy cleaning inside and out, and sealed edges where the door framing meets the wall to insure a sealed fit and maintain a sterile environment.

QTY 12 sets custom doors (two doors per cabinet) with all hardware required for installation.

- Overall opening approximately 36 inches wide and 80 inches tall.

QTY 72 custom shelves (six shelves per cabinet)

- Designed to fit existing bracket tracks in the cabinet
- Designed to support 50lbs per shelf

QTY 330 custom shelf brackets (4 per shelf, with 42 extra brackets)

- Designed to fit existing bracket tracks in the cabinet, or vendor will need provide brackets and tracks in design.

INFECTION PREVENTION MEASURES

- A. Implement the requirements of VAMC's Infection Control Risk Assessment (ICRA) team. ICRA Group may monitor dust in the vicinity of the construction work and require the Contractor to take corrective action immediately if the safe levels are exceeded.
- B. Establish and maintain a dust control program as part of the contractor's infection preventive measures in accordance with the guidelines provided by ICRA Group as specified here. Prior to start of work, prepare a plan detailing project-specific dust protection measures, including periodic status reports, and submit to Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) and Facility ICRA team for review for compliance with contract requirements.
- C. In general, the following preventive measures shall be adopted during construction to keep down dust and prevent mold.
 - i. Doors to Construction Areas - Prior to beginning work in a room, tape over joint between the door and jamb to prevent fumes, dust etc. from leaving the area.
 - ii. Cover non-removable fixtures (headwalls, etc.) with 6 mil plastic sheeting and tape down all sides prior to beginning work.
 - iii. Dampen debris to keep down dust and provide temporary construction partitions in existing structures where directed by Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). Blank off ducts and diffusers to prevent circulation of dust into occupied areas during construction.
 - iv. The contractor shall not haul debris through patient-care areas without prior approval of the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) and the Medical Center. When, approved, debris shall be hauled in enclosed dust proof containers or wrapped in plastic and sealed with duct tape. No sharp objects should be

allowed to cut through the plastic. Wipe down the exterior of the containers, including wheels, with a damp rag to remove dust. All equipment, tools, material, etc. transported through occupied areas shall be made free from dust and moisture by vacuuming and wipe down.

- v. At completion, remove construction barriers and ceiling protection carefully, outside of normal work hours. Vacuum and clean all surfaces free of dust after the removal.

D. Final Cleanup:

- i. Perform HEPA vacuum cleaning of all surfaces in the construction area. This includes walls, ceilings, cabinets, furniture (built-in or free standing), partitions, flooring, etc.
- ii. Wipe all surfaces with disinfectant soaked cloth.
- iii. Wet mop, with disinfectant, floor in entire project area. Use clean microfiber mop pads for each room cleaned.

SECTION C - CONTRACT CLAUSES

SECTION E - SOLICITATION PROVISIONS

- (8) PSC 9610, Ores;
- (9) PSC 9620, Minerals, Natural and Synthetic; and
- (10) PSC 9630, Additive Metal Materials.

“Place of manufacture” means the place where an end product is assembled out of components, or otherwise made or processed from raw materials into the finished product that is to be provided to the Government. If a product is disassembled and reassembled, the place of reassembly is not the place of manufacture.

“Restricted business operations” means business operations in Sudan that include power production activities, mineral extraction activities, oil-related activities, or the production of military equipment, as those terms are defined in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-174). Restricted business operations do not include business operations that the person (as that term is defined in Section 2 of the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007) conducting the business can demonstrate—
