1. <u>Contracting Activity</u>: Department of Veterans Affairs, Program Contracting Office - Fayetteville, Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF), Purchase Request number 101-16-3-727-0009

2. <u>Nature and/or Description of the Action Being Processed:</u>

Request for justification and approval to award a contract to Technical Assistance Collaborative, Inc (TAC). The proposed bridge/interim contract action is a new three (3) months, five (5) days firm fixed price (FFP) task effort. This contract is to provide grant management technical assistance to Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) grantees. SSVF awards \$300 million annually to nearly 400 SSVF grantees serving over 170,000 Veterans and their families in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Virgin Islands. The contract would cover the period of June 25, 2016 thru September 29, 2016.

Description of Supplies/Services Required to Meet the Agency's Needs: SVF is a critical part of VA's strategy to end homelessness among Veterans. SSVF has pioneered new interventions in the field of homelessness through widespread use of rapid re-housing and prevention services. In order for these interventions to be deployed effectively and efficiently, grantees must have access to technical assistance that allows them to provide evidence-based services.

3. Demonstration that the Contractor's Unique Qualifications or Nature of the Acquisition Requires the Use of the Authority Cited Above (applicability of authority): TAC is the incumbent contractor. The goal is to maintain continuity in service until a new long-term contract is awarded, that has been solicited via competitive bid, not later than September 29, 2016. SSVF provides essential resources to communities throughout the country and is a critical component of VA's drive to end homelessness among Veterans. This technical assistance contract is used to support the dissemination of evidence-based practices, provide training on program rules and expectation, and facilitate community planning across Continuums of Care throughout the country. This planning enables VA resources to be used efficiently and effectively, not only in SSVF, but also to support the \$1.4 billion in resources deployed by the Homeless Program Office. As the contract is just over 3 months, it is imperative that the contractor is able to be productive on the first day as the contract is too short to support time to build capacity and program knowledge. This contract will allow VA to bridge the period between the end of the current TAC contract and the award of the new contract without causing a disruption in SSVF service quality. The homelessness program will experience a significant deficit if this bridge in not awarded. Any break in service will directly impact the Veteran by not supplying adequate training and support to community planning and grass root agencies that have direct access to these individuals, in need.

4. <u>Description of Efforts Made to ensure that offers are solicited from as many potential sources as</u> <u>deemed practicable</u>:

This is simply a three month bridge contract. And RFQ for a base plus four years will be solicited on FBO in seven days. An award will be made on or before September 29, 2016.
