PROCEDURES AND FORMATS FOR INSCRIBING STONE NICHE COVERS

GENERAL NOTES:

- The family's surname is always placed on the first line (delineated below the original version).
- The veteran's identification is always shown following the surname, even if the veteran is not the first family member. The remaining inscription line space is a matter which will require consultation of an equal consultation for subsequent family members. The inscription for the first name will precede the next for subsequent generations to accommodate inscription for family members and will, in all cases, show appropriate veteran recognition.
- Above are examples to demonstrate inscription format and procedures. They are based on the maximum allowable number of inscription lines to show an veteran of World War II.

4. The space between two Centuries of Great America is not considered as part of the inscription.

5. For the cases E, H, I, and J, reference drawings A-FINCS-003 are included.

6. The veteran's name and branch of service are also included for veteran recognition.

SCENARIO NO. 1 - The veteran predeceased the non-veteran spouse.

SCENARIO NO. 2 - The veteran predeceased the non-veteran spouse (Scenario No. 1). The spouse is then subsequently married with the veteran. The veteran's name and date of birth and death are not included.

SCENARIO NO. 3 - The non-veteran spouse predeceased the veteran. The veteran's name, rank and branch are included at the time of placement of the inscription. Space is provided to include the veteran's years of birth and death, and war periods, if in fact.

SCENARIO NO. 4 - The non-veteran spouse predeceased the veteran. The veteran is then subsequently married with the spouse. The veteran's years of birth and death are included.

SCENARIO NO. 5 - The veteran predeceased the veteran spouse. The surviving veteran's name, rank and branch of service are also included for veteran recognition.
