## **Governing Law**

Federal law and regulations, including the Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR), shall govern this Contract/Order. If a commercial license agreement is made an addendum, only those provisions addressing data rights regarding the Government's use, duplication and disclosure of data (e.g., restricted computer software) are included and made a part of this Contract/Order, and only to the extent that those provisions are not duplicative or inconsistent with Federal law, Federal regulation, the incorporated FAR clauses and the provisions of this Contract/Order; those provisions in the commercial license agreement that do not address data rights regarding the Government's use, duplication and disclosure of data shall not be included or made a part of the Contract/Order. Federal law and regulation including, without limitation, the Contract Disputes Act (41 U.S.C. § 7101 *et seq.*), the Anti-Deficiency Act (31 U.S.C. § 1341 *et seq.*), the Competition in Contracting Act (41 U.S.C. § 3301 *et seq.*), the Prompt Payment Act (31 U.S.C. § 3901 *et seq.*), Contracts for Data Processing or Maintenance (38 USC § 5725), and FAR clauses 52.212-4, 52.227-14, 52.227-19 shall supersede, control, and render ineffective any inconsistent, conflicting, or duplicative provision in any commercial license agreement. In the event of conflict between this Clause and any provision in the Contract/Order or the commercial license agreement or elsewhere, the terms of this Clause shall prevail. Claims of patent or copyright infringement brought against the Government as a party shall be defended by the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ). 28 U.S.C. § 516. At the discretion of DOJ, the Contractor may be allowed reasonable participation in the defense of the litigation. Any additional changes to the Contract/Order must be made by contract/order modification (Standard Form 30) and shall only be effected by a warranted Contracting Officer. Nothing in this Contract/Order or any commercial license agreement shall be construed as a waiver of sovereign immunity.

## **PRODUCT DESCRIPTION**

### **1.0 BACKGROUND:**

Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), Veterans Health Administration (VHA), Pharmacy Service have identified the need to renew licenses and procure additional modules with licenses for the comprehensive pharmacy database and associated decision support tools. The Commercial Off the Shelf (COTS) database from First Databank (FDB) provides for clinical decision support used in the VA Computerized Patient Record System (CPRS) system, as well as the pharmacy packages. These clinical decision support tools are required for medication order checks such as drug-drug interactions, duplicate therapy, and dosing. These order checks are vital to the mission of VA and will place patients at significant risk if they are not available.

The COTS database is also required for inventory control, claims adjudication, and market research for contracting. COTS data is also used to validate internal VA data such as National Drug Code (NDC) and pricing information.

### **2.0 PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE:**

The period of performance (PoP) consists of a 12-month base period and includes one 12-month option period. Additionally, there are 10 Optional Tasks. The POP for each Optional task shall be up to 12 months from date of Option Exercise, to run concurrent with the period in which it is exercised. Each may be exercised once in the base period and once in the option period.

### **3.0 MEDKNOWLEDGE LICENSE REQUIREMENT:**

The Contractor shall provide copies of the MedKnowledge framework and MedKnowledge information architecture, with all of the associated modules identified in Table 1 below for duration of 12-months from contract award. The Contractor shall provide this database and tools given the following assumptions:

1. The Contractor shall provide VA an enterprise license for 12-months for the framework, architecture and modules identified in the table below.
2. Enterprise wide. The database and tools shall be available to all VA personnel. The database and tools must also be available to VA Contractors working for VA.
3. Non-Proprietary information shall also be shared with users outside VA. For example Department of Defense and other VA vendors.
4. The database and tools shall be accessible by VA developed, open source code designed to utilize the database information.
5. The Contractor shall ensure the information is available for use for the following purposes:
  - a. The information will be accessed by the VA Veterans Health Information Systems and Technology Architecture (VistA) system for use in Pharmacy, Physician order entry, Electronic Medical Records, E-prescribing, Bar Code Administration
  - b. Claims adjudication and processing
  - c. Reports
  - d. Inventory control
  - e. Web sites
  - f. Validation of internal data
6. VA reserves the right to use the information in other ways not listed.

7. VA reserves the right to use consumer drug monographs (i.e. PMI), images, and drug names on VA websites, including the use of National Drug Codes (NDC's) and other identifying information to direct users to the correct information. Any other information contained on the web will be placed either on the VA intranet or be password protected.
8. The Contractor shall provide updates of any changes to the architecture, framework and any modules daily or on another recurring schedule determined by VA, not to exceed daily.
9. The Contractor shall provide updates to the packages listed below. FDB provides custom data for the MedKnowledge Information Architecture (including MedKnowledge Enhanced Package and MedKnowledge Framework) on a monthly basis. The customization is based on specific requests and requirements from VA personnel over the years. Some of these customizations include custom format, custom file length, and custom filtering. Should the VA no longer requires receipt of the custom data, FDB will issue a pro rata refund of the annual customization charge paid in advance for the current term.
10. The Contractor shall provide FDB customer service support for VA personnel and VA Contractors.

(c) For a commercial plan, the minimum goals for award of subcontracts to service-disabled veteran-owned small business concerns and veteran-owned small businesses shall be at least commensurate with the Department's annual service-disabled

d veteran-owned small business and veteran-owned small business prime contracting goals for the total value of projected subcontracts to support the sales for the commercial plan.

(d) To be credited toward goal achievements, businesses must be verified as eligible in the Vendor Information Pages database. The contractor shall annually submit a listing of service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses and veteran-owned small businesses for which credit toward goal achievement is to be applied for the review of personnel in the Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization.

(e) The contractor may appeal any businesses determined not eligible for crediting toward goal achievements by following the procedures contained in 819.407.

## **C.8 VAAR 852.232-72 ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF PAYMENT REQUESTS (NOV 2012)**

(a) *Definitions.* As used in this clause—

(1) *Contract financing payment* has the meaning given in FAR 32.001.

(2) *Designated agency office* has the meaning given in 5 CFR 1315.2(m).

(3) *Electronic form* means an automated system transmitting information electronically according to the

Accepted electronic data transmission methods and formats identified in paragraph (c) of this clause. Facsimile, email, and scanned documents are not acceptable electronic forms for submission of payment requests.

(4) *Invoice payment* has the meaning given in FAR 32.001.

(5) *Payment request* means any request for contract financing payment or invoice payment submitted by the contractor under this contract.

(b) *Electronic payment requests.* Except as provided in paragraph (e) of this clause, the contractor shall submit payment requests in electronic form. Purchases paid with a Government-wide commercial purchase card are considered to be an electronic transaction for purposes of this rule, and therefore no additional electronic invoice submission is required.

(c) *Data transmission.* A contractor must ensure that the data transmission method and format are through one of the following:

(d) *Invoice requirements.* Invoices shall comply with FAR 32.905.

(e) *Exceptions.* If, based on one of the circumstances below, the contracting officer directs that payment requests be made by mail, the contractor shall submit payment requests by mail through the United States Postal Service to the designated agency office. Submission of payment requests by mail may be required for:

(1) Awards made to foreign vendors for work performed outside the United States;



(2) Classified contracts or purchases when electronic submission and processing of payment requests could compromise the safeguarding of classified or privacy information;

(3) Contracts awarded by contracting officers in the conduct of emergency operations, such as responses to national emergencies;

(4) Solicitations or contracts in which the designated agency office is a VA entity other than the VA Financial Services Center in Austin, Texas; or

(5) Solicitations or contracts in which the VA designated agency office does not have electronic invoicing capability as described above.

### **C.9 VAAR 852.237-70 CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITIES (APR 1984)**

The contractor shall obtain all necessary licenses and/or permits required to perform this work. He/she shall take all reasonable precautions necessary to protect persons and property from injury or damage during the performance of this contract. Further, it is agreed that any negligence of the Government, its officers, agents, servants and employees, shall not be the responsibility of the contractor hereunder with the regard to any claims, loss, damage, injury, and liability resulting there from.

Such designation will be in writing and will define the scope and limitation of the designee's authority. A copy of the designation shall be furnished to the contractor.

(2) If the offeror has been involved in the last five years in any of the occurrences listed in (c)(1) of this provision, whether the offeror has provided the requested information with regard to each occurrence.

“Manufactured end product” means any end product in product and service codes (PSCs) 1000-9999, except—

- (1) PSC 5510, Lumber and Related Basic Wood Materials;
- (2) Product or Service Group (PSG) 87, Agricultural Supplies;
- (3) PSG 88, Live Animals;
- (4) PSG 89, Subsistence;
- (5) PSC 9410, Crude Grades of Plant Materials;
- (6) PSC 9430, Miscellaneous Crude Animal Products, Inedible;
- (7) PSC 9440, Miscellaneous Crude Agricultural and Forestry Products;
- (8) PSC 9610, Ores;
- (9) PSC 9620, Minerals, Natural and Synthetic; and
- (10) PSC 9630, Additive Metal Materials.

“Place of manufacture” means the place where an end product is assembled out of components, or otherwise made or processed from raw materials into the finished product that is to be provided to the Government. If a product is disassembled and reassembled, the place of reassembly is not the place of manufacture.

“Predecessor” means an entity that is replaced by a successor and includes any predecessors of the predecessor.

“Restricted business operations” means business operations in Sudan that include power production activities, mineral extraction activities, oil-related activities, or the production of military equipment, as those terms are defined in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-174). Restricted business operations do not include business operations that the person (as that term is defined in Section 2 of the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007) conducting the business can demonstrate—

- (1) Are conducted under contract directly and exclusively with the regional government of southern Sudan;

(2) Are conducted pursuant to specific authorization from the Office of Foreign Assets Control in the Department of the Treasury, or are expressly exempted under Federal law from the requirement to be conducted under such authorization;

(3) Consist of providing goods or services to marginalized populations of Sudan;

(4) Consist of providing goods or services to an internationally recognized peacekeeping force or humanitarian organization;

(5) Consist of providing goods or services that are used only to promote health or education; or

(6) Have been voluntarily suspended.

“Sensitive technology”—

(1) Directly by a parent corporation; or

(2) Through another subsidiary of a parent corporation.

“Successor” means an entity that has replaced a predecessor by acquiring the assets and carrying out the affairs of the predecessor under a new name (often through acquisition or merger). The term “successor” does not include new offices/divisions of the same company or a company that only changes its name. The extent of the responsibility of the successor for the liabilities of the predecessor may vary, depending on State law and specific circumstances.

“Veteran-owned small business concern” means a small business concern—
