This acquisition is conducted under the authority of the Multiple Award Schedule Program. (2) NATURE AND/OR DESCRIPTION OF ACTION BEING APPROVED:

Purchase of additional hardware and software implementation in support of the VISN-wide Anesthesia Record Keeper (ARK) System for the new VA Medical Center in New Orleans, LA. The original contract, VA256-14-F-3608, for the ARK System was competitively awarded to Draeger Medical, Inc. against their FSS contract V797P-4081B in 2014. The contract included the current APU environment for New Orleans because both the timeline and specific requirements for the new VAMC were uncertain at time of the procurement and award. The new VAMC in New Orleans is scheduled to open near the ARK implementation timeframe; therefore, it is determined to be in the best interest to by-pass the APU and implement directly into the new facility. This requires additional hardware, software licensing, and implementation requirements that are now identified.

(3) (a) A DESCRIPTION OF THE SUPPLIES OR SERVICES REQUIRED TO MEET THE AGENCY'S NEED:

Additional MDS-7 clinical workstations running the Draeger Innovian 6.1 product

An increased number of labor hours for implementation and support of the increased number of workstations and clinical software licenses.

Additional interface drivers to capture data from additional physiological monitoring devices.

Added labor hours for training a greater number of individuals at the facilities.

(b) ESTIMATED DOLLAR VALUE: \$374,100.36 for base year; \$37,305.04 each for option years 1 and 2, \$61,790.82 each for option years 3 and 4. Grand total = \$572,292.08

These are "direct replacements" parts/components for existing equipment.

VISN 16 awarded a competitive contract to Draeger for the Innovian 6.1 product in 2014. The original contract with Draeger included the current APU environment for New Orleans because both the timeline and specific requirements for the new VAMC were uncertain at time of procurement. The new VAMC in New Orleans is scheduled to open near the ARK implementation so it more advantageous to by-pass the APU and implement directly into the new facility. This requires additional hardware, software licensing, and implementation requirements. This project is nationally driven to be a VISN-centric system; the components at each facility must be the same to allow for VISN-level management and data extraction. Furthermore, the current contract covers all facilities in VISN 16 and has partial requirements fulfilled in several facilities. If a different product was selected, than a provider in one hospital would have to use different systems for the same function depending upon which operating room he or she was working in. These systems would not communicate either, so the same data for the same patient could be displayed in different fields and contexts in different systems, leading to a very high risk to patient safety.

The new work is a logical follow-on to an original Federal Supply Schedule order provided that the original order was placed in accordance with the applicable Federal Supply Schedule ordering procedures. The original order must not have been previously issued under sole source or limited source procedures.

The original VISN-wide contract was competitively awarded in 2014 and this contract would be a logical follow on to the initial award. The procurement will be for additional hardware, software, licenses, etc. that was acquired originally and is needed for a fully supported system for the New Orleans, LA Legacy VAMC. The specific requirements for NOLA were not known at the time of the 2014 award.

An urgent and compelling need exists, and following the ordering procedures would result in unacceptable delays.

Excessive delays to implementation of this project could result in additional expenses or reassignment of contractor resources to other projects, which would result in unacceptably long delays. In addition, the contractor already has a previous contract to perform part of the work at this location. This new contract is to provide the additional requirements to implement the Draeger Innovian ARK in the new facility in New Orleans vs. in the current APU environment.

(5) DESCRIBE WHY YOU BELIEVE THE ORDER REPRESENTS THE BEST VALUE CONSISTENT WITH FAR 8.4 TO AID THE CONTRACTING OFFICER IN MAKING THIS BEST VALUE DETERMINATION:

The original contract was awarded to Draeger on a best value basis using published FSS/GSA price schedules. These new additional requirements for New Orleans are in line with these prices and it is therefore reasonable to assume that they would be the best value as well. Regardless, the overall costs of starting over would result in a large sunk cost that would vastly outweigh any possible small savings from a new competition and represent an increase risk to patient safety.

(6) DESCRIBE THE MARKET RESEARCH CONDUCTED AMONG SCHEDULE HOLDERS AND THE RESULTS OR A STATEMENT OF THE REASON MARKET RESEARCH WAS NOT CONDUCTED:

Market research was conducted for the original procurement. However, for this procurement, it is not feasible to compete the requirement. There is no viable path forward with this project unless Draeger is awarded the contract for the additional requirements. If this is not done, then the alternatives are to implement the system in part at New Orleans; which represents a huge risk to patient safety as explained earlier, or to scrap the project entirely and start over. This second option would result in significant loss of funds already spent and would delay the project for an unacceptably long period of time, increasing risks to patient care.

(7) ANY OTHER FACTS SUPPORTING THE JUSTIFICATION:

This is part of an overarching nationally driven, VISN centered project. Success or failure in VISN 16 will influence success or failure VA-wide. This procurement is an emergency buy as key information affecting requirements and necessary to move forward with procurement was still under development at the site until very recently.




