B.4 STATEMENT OF WORK

1. CONTRACT TITLE: Medical Gas Delivery and Cylinder Tank Rental

2. REQUIRING FACILITIES:

Hunter Holmes McGuire VA Medical Center (Richmond VAMC)
 Charlottesville Community Based Outpatient Clinic (CBOC)
 Emporia Community Based Outpatient Clinic (CBOC)
 Fredericksburg Community Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs)

3. BACKGROUND

The Hunter Holmes VA Medical Center in Richmond, Virginia, and associated facilities, require medical gas cylinder delivery in accordance with this Statement of Work. The gases to be purchased include those listed under Section 7 of this Statement of Work. This contract is to provide both the medical gases identified in Section 7, as well as rental cylinder tanks (Contractor-owned Property).

4. SCOPE

The contractor shall provide all labor and materials to deliver contractor-owned gas cylinders, to the requiring facility, on an as needed basis, throughout the period of performance (ordering period). The quantities shown in Section 7 of this Statement of Work are estimates of the facility's annual requirements for medical gases. There is no express or implied guarantee that these quantities will be purchased. See the price/cost schedule of the contract for the period of performance. The Contractor will be provided with names and contact information of primary and back-up Facility Points of Contact (Facility POCs).

5. TASKS

- 5.1. The contractor shall deliver to the facility, the medical gases identified in Section 7 of this Statement of Work, in the frequency identified in that section.
- 5.2. The Facility POC(s) will contact the Contractor to request refills of all medical gases supplied under this contract, except Portable Oxygen.
- 5.3. The contractor will provide Portable Oxygen, in an automatic supply stop, on a weekly basis, as shown in the table in Section 7.
- 5.4. Tanks(s) will be filled to maximum functional capacity at each refilling procedure unless otherwise specified in the facility requirements or as agreed upon in a written document signed and dated by the Facility POC.
- 5.5. Emergency delivery will be provided within 24 hours after receipt of Government notification. Contractor must respond to the facility by either telephone or email within one hour to confirm receipt of emergency notification to ascertain the nature of the emergency. Emergency status is determined by the Government when conditions warrant. Failure of the contractor to remain current with the agreed delivery schedule and requirements does not constitute an “emergency” for purposes of charging an emergency delivery fee. Material Safety Data Sheets shall be provided to the facility COTR upon request at no additional charge.
- 5.6. Prior to first filling, and annually thereafter, the contractor must verify, in writing, the accuracy of all gauges on contractor owned tanks.
- 5.7. On a quarterly basis, the Contractor shall take an inventory of actual cylinders, on-site at the facilities, to verify the accuracy of inventory counts.
- 5.8. The Contractor will provide 24/7 emergency contact name(s) and telephone number(s).

6. ORDERING

The Facility POC(s) will submit requests for delivery of medical gases and rental cylinders to the Contractor, no later than 05:00 PM EST for *delivery within 48 hours*, including weekends, via email to the Contractor POCs identified in the below table. Vendor must notify the facility of the planned delivery, scheduled within the 48 hour window, including the date and time. After contract award, the Facility POCs and the Contractor may agree upon a defined delivery schedule, such as Thursdays, on a weekly basis.

8. GAS DELIVERIES, DISTRIBUTION PROCEDURES AND RECALLS

- 8.1. All deliveries will be made on an as needed basis, upon request by the Facility POC(s).
- 8.2. Upon request for delivery, the contractor shall make delivery of the identified cylinders, within 48 hours.
- 8.3. At the time of each delivery, contractor must provide a legible signed and dated written document that identifies the tank level prior to fill, the level after fill, and the quantity delivered. This document must be counter-signed by a facility representative supervising the delivery.
- 8.4. If for any reason the contractor is unable to make delivery at an agreed upon day or time, the contractor will provide 24-hour notice to the Facility POC, so that the facility can initiate an alternate backup action. In accordance with VHA Patient Safety Alert dated

April 5, 2004, all deliveries must be monitored by a qualified and trained technical representative that will be designated by each facility. Contractor will be provided with names and contact information of primary and back-up facility representatives (Facility POCs). This applies to all deliveries regardless of time or day of execution.

8.5. The Facility POC is responsible for communicating local issues, such as ordering and delivery instructions, within the terms and conditions of the signed contract. The terms and conditions outlined by this contract cannot be changed without signed modification by the Contracting Officer.

8.6. Medical gases are subject to the requirements in 21 CFR § 211.150 - Distribution procedures.

8.7. The Contractor shall have an established system by which the distribution of each lot of gases can be readily determined to facilitate its recall if necessary.

10. INVOICING

10.1. The Contractor shall submit one invoice, monthly, for incurred charges related to medical gas refill and cylinder tank rental fees. The amount charged for cylinder tank rental shall be for the quantity and types of cylinders in facility inventory, as of the last day of the month. The facility shall not be invoiced for tanks for which the facility has requested removal. Medical gas shall be invoiced on the basis of volume for tanks delivered during the invoicing period (one month).

10.2. Emergency deliveries will be invoiced under a separate obligation, for deliveries made in the previous month, through obligation to cover costs incurred in a future period, or through the use of Government Purchase Card for individual deliveries, as they occur.

11. GOVERNMENT FURNISHED PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

No Government furnished property or equipment is provided under this contract.

12. CONTRACTOR-OWNED EQUIPMENT

- 12.1. Contractor owned equipment shall be installed, inspected and maintained by the contractor at the Contractor's expense (i.e., all installation, inspection and maintenance costs shall be included in the contract's monthly equipment rental fee for the applicable facility.)
- 12.2. Through the duration of the contract, the contractor shall be liable for the integrity, suitability, and safety of contractor owned tank(s), ensuring compliance with applicable regulations, standards and FDA Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) for medical gases.
- 12.3. Manifold cylinders for the reserve supply, liquid converter, alarm switch, regulator, valves, level indicator, and any other devices or connections required for proper tie-ins with the facility's gas system shall be furnished by the contractor, without cost to the Government.
- 12.4. The manifold or liquid converters shall deliver all gases at a pressure and rate of flow adequate to supply the system. Each medical gas storage container shall have an outlet that allows access for testing the purity of the gases.

13. QUALITY ASSURANCE SPECIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

- 13.1. All medical gas manufacturers and fillers of medical gases must be registered with FDA as drug manufacturers.
- 13.2. All medical gases delivered under this contract shall be manufactured, processed, packed, transported, and stored according to FDA's Current Good Manufacturing Practices (CGMP) regulations, and all labeling shall comply with FDA's labeling regulations (21 CFR Part 201).
- 13.3. All medical gases delivered under this contract shall be medical-grade and shall meet or exceed the standards cited in the current edition of the United States Pharmacopoeia/National Formulary (U.S.P.).
- 13.4. A valid certificate of analysis (COA) shall be provided with each delivery of the medical gases provided under this contract. The certificate shall include, at a minimum:
 - 13.4.1. Supplier's name and complete address
 - 13.4.2. Name of the Product (i.e. Oxygen U.S.P.)
 - 13.4.3. An Air Liquefaction Statement where appropriate
 - 13.4.4. Lot number or other unique identification number
 - 13.4.5. Actual analytical results for full U.S.P. monograph testing. (A statement that only states that the product meets the minimum purity of 99.5%, etc. is not acceptable.)

- 13.4.6. Test method used to perform the analysis. (A statement such as “Meets U.S.P. specifications” is not acceptable; nor would “Tested via Servomex” be acceptable since the specific model number is not provided.)
- 13.4.7. Signature of authorized supplier representative and date.
- 13.4.8. Material Safety Data Sheets shall be provided to the Facility POC, upon request.
- 13.4.9. A copy of all inspection reports shall be provided to the Facility POC, upon the completion of any contractor-owned system inspections that are required by regulation.
- 13.4.10. All contractor-owned equipment shall be maintained or repaired in accordance with FDA’s Current Good Manufacturing Practices (CGMP) Regulations.

14. APPLICABLE REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS

- 14.1. The following is a list of some of the regulations and standards that are applicable to this contract. The list is not comprehensive, and the contractor is responsible for ensuring that all products, equipment and services provided under the contract are in compliance with applicable Federal, state, and local regulations. If applicable, the editions in effect as of the date of this contract are listed. The Contractor is responsible for remaining compliant with any future revisions that become effective during the contract period of performance (ordering period).
- 14.2. Title 21, Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 201, 210, and 211 - CGMP regulations.
- 14.3. 29 CFR 1910 Subpart H – Hazardous Materials
- 14.4. CFR Title 49 – Transportation
- 14.5. NFPA 55: Compressed Gases and Cryogenic Fluids Code
- 14.6. NFPA 99: Health Care Facilities Code
- 14.7. ASSE 6000 Medical Gas Systems Certification

15. CYLINDERS AND OTHER CONTAINERS

- 15.1. *Laws and Regulations:* Cylinders and other containers for gaseous and liquid forms of gases shall comply with the Department of Transportation specifications and shall be maintained, filled, marked, labeled, and shipped to comply with current DOT regulations (Title 49-Transportation, Code of Federal Regulations.) Filling, packaging, labeling, etc., for medical gases shall also comply with the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.
- 15.2. *Marking:* In addition to marking required by the aforementioned laws and regulations, marking shall comply with CGA Publication C-7 - *Guide to Preparation*

of Precautionary Labeling and Marking of Compressed Gas Containers, dated 10/21/2011.

- 15.3. *Color Coding:* Cylinders shall be color coded in accordance with CGA Publication C-9 -- *Standard Color Marking of Compressed Gas Containers Intended for Medical Use*, dated 3/10/04.
- 15.4. Valves shall comply with CGA Safety Bulletin SB-26 dated 05/2007 and CGA Publication V-1 -*Compressed Gas Association Standard for Compressed Gas Cylinder Valve Outlet and Inlet. Connections*, dated 11/14/05. Valve protection caps for cylinders designed to receive such caps shall be securely attached to the cylinders in a manner to protect the valves from injury during transit and delivery to the purchaser's receiving area. For liquid containers, all fittings must be permanently brazed to prevent their removal. In addition, each container should contain a 360 degree cryoband applied at the top of the container with the drug product name repeated around the entire container.
- 15.5. *Hydrostatic Testing:*
 - 15.5.1. Retest Date: If applicable DOT regulations would require retesting of cylinder within three (3) months after scheduled date of shipment to Continental U.S. destination, or within six (6) months after scheduled date of shipment to overseas destination, cylinder shall be retested. Contractor will be required to retest any Government-Owned cylinder when requested by ordering activity, regardless of scheduled retest data.
 - 15.5.2. Method: *Government-owned* cylinders which are eligible for extended hydrostatic retest period, testing by modified hydrostatic method, or visual inspection in lieu of hydrostatic testing, shall be serviced by the most economical means which will comply with Department of Transportation regulations (49 CFR 173.34, Qualification, maintenance and use of cylinders) unless otherwise specified by the ordering activity. When modified or reduced DOT test requirements are contingent upon past usage of the cylinders, a written statement from the ordering activity indicating that the cylinders have been used exclusively for a specific gas may be considered acceptable evidence of the cylinders' eligibility for modified testing or inspection.
 - 15.5.3. Hydrostatic testing shall be performed in accordance with CGA's Publication -- C-1, *Methods For Hydrostatic Testing of Compressed Gas Cylinders*, dated 07/17/2009.
- 15.6. Visual inspection shall be performed in accordance with the applicable CGA Publications C-6 --*Standards for Visual Inspection of Steel Compressed Gas Cylinders*, dated 03/08/2007 or C- 6.1 -- *Standards for Visual Inspection of High Pressure Aluminum Compressed Gas Cylinders*, dated 12/21/2006.
- 15.7. The contractor shall be responsible for all testing of contractor-owned cylinders at no additional cost to the Government. The government shall pay for the hydrostatic testing of government-owned cylinders at the prices listed in 6.2.

- 15.8. *Cylinder Sizes:* Cylinder sizes shown in the item description indicate product capacity of the cylinder currently being used. All capacities are approximate, and the Government shall be billed only for the actual amount of gas delivered. In accordance with the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, the actual contents of the container must appear on the label.
- 15.9. *Lost or Damaged Contractor-Owned Cylinders:* For each contractor-owned cylinder lost or damaged beyond repair while in the Government's possession, the Government shall pay to the Contractor the replacement value, less the allocable rental paid for that cylinder. These cylinders shall become Government property. If any lost cylinder is located within 30 calendar days after payment by the Government, it may be returned to the Contractor by the Government, and the Contractor shall pay to the Government an amount equal to the replacement value, less rental, computed in accordance with section 8 of this Statement of Work.
- 15.10. *Transportation of Cylinders:* All transportation charges for empty government-owned and contractor-owned cylinders from the ordering facility to the contractor's facility shall be at the expense of the contractor.

16. PRICE OF SERVICES FOR CONTRACTOR-OWNED CYLINDERS

Services Included in the Price of Gas: The offeror's price for the gas shall include the furnishing, at no additional cost, of all services which are required at each and every filling of a cylinder to comply with applicable regulations, specifications, and normal good practices. Such services shall include, but not be limited to: tags indicating cylinder is "Full," "In Use," or "Empty"; inspection, testing, evaluation, and cleaning services required at each and every filling; pin-indexing, when required, and attachment of warning tags, when required. Attaching of oxygen cylinders to manifold systems, when required, shall also be performed by the contractor at no additional cost. In addition to services listed in this paragraph, the contractor is responsible for all maintenance and testing of contractor-owned cylinders.

17. MEASUREMENT AND CONVERSION COMPUTATION: ATMOSPHERIC GASES AND HYDROGEN:

Density data and volume measurement equivalents printed in CGA Publication P-6 -- *Standard Density Data, Atmospheric Gases and Hydrogen*, dated 8/17/05 shall be used when necessary to convert measurement of these gases from one form to another; for example, from cubic feet to gallons.

18. MONTHLY RENTAL OF CONTRACTOR-OWNED CYLINDERS AND LIQUID CONTAINERS:

- 18.1. Cylinders picked up by contractor's truck: Ordering activities shall notify the contractor of the number and type of empty cylinders ready for return. No rental charges shall be applied to any cylinder five days (Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excluded) after the ordering activity has notified the contractor. The day the contractor is notified is excluded from the five-day period. If the contractor is verbally notified of empty cylinders, the ordering activity will document the notification by making a record of the date, time and contractor's representative contacted.

- 18.2. Cylinders returned by common carrier: Ordering activities returning empty contractor owned cylinders will immediately notify the contractor in writing of the quantity and size of cylinders and the date they were turned over to the carrier. Rental charges shall not be applied after the date cylinders are picked up by the common carrier.
- 18.3. NOTE: Please indicate the day of the month that rental charges will be applied (See 8a): _____ (e.g. 15th, 25th, last day, etc.

You have a total of 60 calendar days following the Assessing Official signature date to submit comments. Any comments that you submit will be posted to PPIRS. If you do not sign and return the evaluation within 60 calendar days the evaluation will be returned to the Assessing Official, you will no longer be able to provide comments and the evaluation will be annotated as follows: 'The report was delivered/received by the contractor on (date). The contractor neither signed nor offered comment in response to this evaluation.' Partially completed comments that were not signed and returned to the Government within 60 calendar days will be removed from the evaluation.

(f) The following guidelines apply concerning your use of the past performance evaluation:

(1) Protect the evaluation as "source selection information." After review, transit the evaluation by completing and submitting the form through CPARS. If for some reason you are unable to view and/or submit the form through CPARS, contact the Contracting Officer for instructions.

C.3 52.203-99 PROHIBITION ON CONTRACTING WITH ENTITIES THAT REQUIRE CERTAIN INTERNAL CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENTS (DEVIATION) (FEB 2015)

(a) The Contractor shall not require employees or contractors seeking to report fraud, waste, or abuse to sign or comply with internal confidentiality agreements or statements prohibiting or otherwise restricting such employees or subcontractors from lawfully reporting such waste, fraud, or abuse to a designated investigative or law enforcement representative of a Federal department or agency authorized to receive such information.

(d)(1) In accordance with section 743 of Division E, Title VII, of the Consolidated and Further Continuing Resolution Appropriations Act, 2015 (Pub. L. 113-235), use of funds appropriated (or otherwise made available) under that or any other Act may be prohibited, if the Government determines that the Contractor is not in compliance with the provisions of this clause.

(2) The Government may seek any available remedies in the event the contractor fails to comply with the provisions of this clause.

C.4 52.216-3 ECONOMIC PRICE ADJUSTMENT—SEMISTANDARD SUPPLIES (JAN 1997)

(a) The Contractor warrants that the supplies identified as line items in the Schedule are, except for modifications required by the contract specifications, supplies for which it has an established price. The term "established price" means a price that (1) is an established catalog or market price for a commercial item sold in substantial quantities to the general public, and (2) is the net price after applying any standard trade discounts offered by the Contractor. The Contractor further warrants that, as of the date of this contract, any difference between the unit prices stated in the contract for these line items and the Contractor's established prices for like quantities of the nearest commercial equivalents are due to compliance with contract specifications and with any contract requirements for preservation, packaging, and packing beyond standard commercial practice.

(b) The Contractor shall promptly notify the Contracting Officer of the amount and effective date of each decrease in any applicable established price. Each corresponding contract unit price (exclusive of any part of the unit price that reflects modifications resulting from compliance with specifications or with requirements for preservation, packaging, and packing beyond standard commercial practice) shall be decreased by the same percentage that the established price is decreased. The decrease shall apply to those items delivered on and after the effective date of the decrease in the Contractor's established price, and this contract shall be modified accordingly.

(c) If the Contractor's applicable established price is increased after the contract date, the corresponding contract unit price (exclusive of any part of the unit price resulting from compliance with specifications or with requirements for preservation, packaging, and packing beyond standard commercial practice) shall be increased, upon the Contractor's written request to the Contracting Officer, by the same percentage that the established price is increased, and the contract shall be modified accordingly, subject to the following limitations:

(1) The aggregate of the increases in any contract unit price under this clause shall not exceed 10 percent of the original contract unit price.

(2) The increased contract unit price shall be effective—

(i) On the effective date of the increase in the applicable established price if the Contracting Officer receives the Contractor's written request within 10 days thereafter; or

(ii) If the written request is received later, on the date the Contracting Officer receives the request.

(3) The increased contract unit price shall not apply to quantities scheduled under the contract for delivery before the effective date of the increased contract unit price, unless failure to deliver before that date results from causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor, within the meaning of the Default clause.

(4) No modification increasing a contract unit price shall be executed under this paragraph (c) until the Contracting Officer verifies the increase in the applicable established price.

(5) Within 30 days after receipt of the Contractor's written request, the Contracting Officer may cancel, without liability to either party, any undelivered portion of the contract items affected by the requested increase.

(d) During the time allowed for the cancellation provided for in paragraph (c)(5) of this clause, and thereafter if there is no cancellation, the Contractor shall continue deliveries according to the contract delivery schedule, and the Government shall pay for such deliveries at the contract unit price, increased to the extent provided by paragraph (c) of this clause.

(End of Clause)

C.5 52.216-18 ORDERING (OCT 1995)

(a) Any supplies and services to be furnished under this contract shall be ordered by issuance of delivery orders or task orders by the individuals or activities designated in the Schedule. Such orders may be issued from 01 June 2017 through 31 May 2018.

(b) All delivery orders or task orders are subject to the terms and conditions of this contract. In the event of conflict between a delivery order or task order and this contract, the contract shall control.

(c) If mailed, a delivery order or task order is considered "issued" when the Government deposits the order in the mail. Orders may be issued orally, by facsimile, or by electronic commerce methods only if authorized in the Schedule.

(End of Clause)

C.6 52.216-19 ORDER LIMITATIONS (OCT 1995)

(a) *Minimum order.* When the Government requires supplies or services covered by this contract in an amount of less than N/A for Requirements Contract, the Government is not obligated to purchase, nor is the Contractor obligated to furnish, those supplies or services under the contract.

(b) *Maximum order.* The Contractor is not obligated to honor—

(1) Any order for a single item in excess of ESTIMATED VALUE OF THE PERIOD, FOR ALL CLINs;

(2) Any order for a combination of items in excess of ESTIMATED VALUE OF THE PERIOD, FOR ALL CLINs; or

(3) A series of orders from the same ordering office within 3 days that together call for quantities exceeding the limitation in paragraph (b)(1) or (2) of this section.

(c) If this is a requirements contract (i.e., includes the Requirements clause at subsection 52.216-21 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR)), the Government is not required to order a part of any one requirement from the Contractor if that requirement exceeds the maximum-order limitations in paragraph (b) of this section.

(d) Notwithstanding paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section, the Contractor shall honor any order exceeding the maximum order limitations in paragraph (b), unless that order (or orders) is returned to the ordering office within 3 days after issuance, with written notice stating the Contractor's intent not to ship the item (or items) called for and the reasons. Upon receiving this notice, the Government may acquire the supplies or services from another source.

(End of Clause)

C.7 52.216-21 REQUIREMENTS (OCT 1995)

(a) This is a requirements contract for the supplies or services specified, and effective for the period stated, in the Schedule. The quantities of supplies or services specified in the Schedule are estimates only and are not purchased by this contract. Except as this contract may otherwise provide, if the Government's requirements do not result in orders in the quantities described as "estimated" or "maximum" in the Schedule, that fact shall not constitute the basis for an equitable price adjustment.

(b) Delivery or performance shall be made only as authorized by orders issued in accordance with the Ordering clause. Subject to any limitations in the Order Limitations clause or elsewhere in this contract, the Contractor shall furnish to the Government all supplies or services specified in the Schedule and called for by orders issued in accordance with the Ordering clause. The Government may issue orders requiring delivery to multiple destinations or performance at multiple locations.

(c) Except as this contract otherwise provides, the Government shall order from the Contractor all the supplies or services specified in the Schedule that are required to be purchased by the Government activity or activities specified in the Schedule.

(d) The Government is not required to purchase from the Contractor requirements in excess of any limit on total orders under this contract.

(e) If the Government urgently requires delivery of any quantity of an item before the earliest date that delivery may be specified under this contract, and if the Contractor will not accept an order providing for the accelerated delivery, the Government may acquire the urgently required goods or services from another source.

(f) Any order issued during the effective period of this contract and not completed within that period shall be completed by the Contractor within the time specified in the order. The contract shall govern the Contractor's and Government's rights and obligations with respect to that order to the same extent as if the order were completed during the contract's effective period; provided, that the Contractor shall not be required to make any deliveries under this contract after 31 MAY 2022.

(End of Clause)

C.8 52.217-6 OPTION FOR INCREASED QUANTITY (MAR 1989)

The Government may increase the quantity of supplies called for in the Schedule at the unit price specified. The Contracting Officer may exercise the option by written notice to the Contractor within fifteen (15) days. Delivery of the added items shall continue at the same rate as the like items called for under the contract, unless the parties otherwise agree.

(End of Clause)

C.9 52.217-9 OPTION TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE CONTRACT (MAR 2000)

(a) The Government may extend the term of this contract by written notice to the Contractor within THIRTY (30) days; provided that the Government gives the Contractor a preliminary written notice of its intent to extend at least SIXTY (60) days before the contract expires. The preliminary notice does not commit the Government to an extension.

(b) If the Government exercises this option, the extended contract shall be considered to include this option clause.

(c) The total duration of this contract, including the exercise of any options under this clause, shall not exceed FIVE (5) YEARS.

(End of Clause)

C.10 52.223-3 HAZARDOUS MATERIAL IDENTIFICATION AND MATERIAL SAFETY DATA (JAN 1997) ALTERNATE I (JUL 1995)

(a) "Hazardous material," as used in this clause, includes any material defined as hazardous under the latest version of Federal Standard No. 313 (including revisions adopted during the term of the contract).

(b) The offeror must list any hazardous material, as defined in paragraph (a) of this clause, to be delivered under this contract. The hazardous material shall be properly identified and include any applicable identification number, such as National Stock Number or Special Item Number. This information shall also be included on the Material Safety Data Sheet submitted under this contract.

Material (If none, insert "None")	Identification No.

(c) This list must be updated during performance of the contract whenever the Contractor determines that any other material to be delivered under this contract is hazardous.

(d) The apparently successful offeror agrees to submit, for each item as required prior to award, a Material Safety Data Sheet, meeting the requirements of 29 CFR 1910.1200(g) and the latest version of Federal Standard No. 313, for all hazardous material identified in paragraph (b) of this clause. Data shall be submitted in accordance with Federal Standard No. 313, whether or not the apparently successful offeror is the actual manufacturer of these items. Failure to submit the Material Safety Data Sheet prior to award may result in the apparently successful offeror being considered nonresponsible and ineligible for award.

(e) If, after award, there is a change in the composition of the item(s) or a revision to Federal Standard No. 313, which renders incomplete or inaccurate the data submitted under paragraph (d) of this clause, the Contractor shall promptly notify the Contracting Officer and resubmit the data.

(f) Neither the requirements of this clause nor any act or failure to act by the Government shall relieve the Contractor of any responsibility or liability for the safety of Government, Contractor, or subcontractor personnel or property.

(g) Nothing contained in this clause shall relieve the Contractor from complying with applicable Federal, State, and local laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations (including the obtaining of licenses and permits) in connection with hazardous material.
