## 3. UNIQUE CHARACTERISTICS THAT LIMIT AVAILABILITY TO ONLY ONE SOURCE, WITH THE REASON NO OTHER SUPPLIES OR SERVICES CAN BE USED:

The Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center located in Milwaukee, Wi is requesting a new mobile Swallow Workstation and Endoscope Video System. The station requires an endoscopy video system and video recorder. The facility's existing system is running on Windows XP which is an unsupported OS platform, unable to receive security updates from Microsoft. The existing equipment does not have an integration system that can disperse images and have videos/images viewed from anywhere but the onboard the local station. This causes a delay in patient care and disease prognosis as multiple providers/departments utilize this cart. Review of any captured data can only be viewed if the reviewer is at the physical station. The new system will be able to integrate with the Image Stream VaultStream Server that is hosted in Milwaukee. Components of the VaultStream server are also on the One-VA TRM approval list so clinicians can have the appropriate software loaded on any workstation in the facility where captured videos/images can be viewed. The server also has approved Live Stream capability so consults/education could be conducted for users that are not present at the speech study.

Olympus is the only approved vendor of the Image Stream video storage devices that can be integrated with the VaultStream server. This device is also a VistA DICOM-approved modality. Along with keeping standardization with Olympus video processors, rigid and flexible scopes with the purchase of this equipment can ensure all endoscopes can be reprocessed by the OER-PRO and Sterrad NX that is currently on-hand. If the Government were to purchase through another manufacturer, it would cost an additional \$50,000.00 for the server integration components and up to \$78,000.00 for new reprocessors. It is therefore in the best interest of the Government to purchase Olympus of America, Inc.-brand equipment to fulfill the need of the facility.

4. REASON THAT SUGGESTED SOURCE IS THE ONLY SOURCE, WHICH CAN PROVIDE THE SUPPLIES OR SERVICES: Past procurements have shown that Olympus America, Inc. Alliant can provide pricing at or below the price of Olympus's NAC contract which is found to be fair and reasonable.

It is determined this procurement will be fulfilled via open market sole source to Alliant Enterprises, LLC (DUNS: 121170653) utilizing the Veterans First Contracting Program IAW Public Law (PL) 109-461 which requires the Veterans Affairs (VA) to increase contracting and subcontracting opportunities for Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses and Veteran-Owned Small Businesses.
