**PROJECT TITLE: SATELLITE TV SUBSCRIPTION AND HD UPGRADE FOR VA GREATER LOS ANGELES

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial services/items prepared in accordance with the format in FAR Subpart 12.6 in conjunction with FAR Part 13, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; quotes are being requested and a separate written solicitation will not be issued. This combined synopsis/solicitation is issued as a request for quote (RFQ) VA262-17-Q-0994.

Submit written offers in accordance with Addendum to FAR 52.212-1, Instruction to Offerors outlined in pages 24 – 25 of this solicitation. Oral offers will not be accepted. This solicitation document and incorporated provisions and clauses are those in effect through Federal Acquisition Circular (FAC) 2005-95 effective January 19, 2017. North American Industrial Classification Standard (NAICS) 515210, *Cable and Other Subscription Programming*, and a Size Standard of \$38.5M apply to this procurement. This requirement is set-aside for 100% Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB).

VAGLAHS intend to award a firm fixed price contract for upgrade the current satellite television system to a digital HD system and provide digital satellite programming for 855 televisions. A service contract will be awarded for the required services in accordance with the Statement of Work. The service will begin upon receipt of Notice of award of contract, and the subscription digital satellite programming will have one (1) Year Base and four (4) Option Years. The contractor shall provide all supplies, materials, parts, equipment, labor, supervision, management and transportation to perform all task to provide the required service in accordance with the Statement of Work.

This procurement is being conducted under FAR Subpart 13.5 – Simplified Procedures for Certain Commercial Items.

This procurement is a SDVOSB set-aside and all eligible offerors are encouraged to submit offers. To be eligible for award offeror(s) must be Verified in the Vendor Information Pages (VIP) (<https://www.vip.vetbiz.gov>) at the close of this solicitation AND must be registered with the System for Award Management (SAM) (<https://www.sam.gov>) at the time of award.

B.2 LIMITATIONS ON SUBCONTRACTING-- MONITORING AND COMPLIANCE (JUN 2011)

This solicitation includes VAAR 852.219-10 VA Notice of Total Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business set-aside. Accordingly, any contract resulting from this solicitation will include this clause. The contractor is advised in performing contract administration functions, the CO may use the services of a support contractor(s) retained by VA to assist in assessing the contractor's compliance with the limitations on subcontracting or percentage of work performance requirements specified in the clause. To that end, the support contractor(s) may require access to contractor's offices where the contractor's business records or other proprietary data are retained and to review such business records regarding the contractor's compliance with this requirement. All support contractors conducting this review on behalf of VA will be required to sign an "Information Protection and Non-Disclosure and Disclosure of Conflicts of Interest Agreement" to ensure the contractor's business records or other proprietary data reviewed or obtained in the course of assisting the CO in assessing the contractor for compliance are protected to ensure information or data is not improperly disclosed or other impropriety occurs. B.3 STATEMENT OF WORK

1. BACKGROUND

The VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System (VAGLAHS) has identified a need for High Definition (HD) digital satellite programming for eight hundred fifty-five (855) TV's located throughout the VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System.

The Contractor shall provide all supplies, materials, parts, equipment, labor, supervision, management and transportation to perform all tasks as identified below. The contractor shall provide 24/7 telephone technical support and onsite 24/7 technical support when needed. All work is to be performed in accordance with the guidelines established by Federal, State, and local ordinances, Manufacturer's Service Manual, Quality Control Manual, and with all terms conditions, provisions, schedules and specifications herein.

2. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

Provide subscription television service to the West Los Angeles, and Sepulveda VA Medical Facility to identified Buildings which include hospitals, Office, Domiciliary, and other locations as specified so that they can distribute the signal to 855 television drops around the facilities using the government provided distribution system and existing Analog CATV Network.

Upgrade existing Standard Definition with 480P lines of resolution subscription television service to High Definition with 1080P Lines of resolution, replacing all Standard Definition with High Definition Out Door Units and In Door Units with SWM ODU's, receivers, and compatible modulators to transmit High Definition Digital signal through existing Analog CATV Network to Digital ready government owned televisions.

3. SPECIFIC TASKS

The contractor shall perform the following tasks:

- Provide and install one (1) HD 3 LNB Satellite Antenna for One (1) Satellite Master Antenna Television (SMATV) Network to be installed on Building 99, VA Sepulveda Ambulatory Care Center, 16111 Plummer Street, North Hills, CA 91343.

- Provide and install Four (4) HD 3 LNB Satellite Antennas for Three (3) Satellite Master Antenna Television (SMATV) Network to be installed on Building 214, 500, Police Department; and One (1) each HD 3 LNB Satellite Antenna for Building 218, VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare System, 11301 Wilshire Blvd., Los Angeles CA 90073.

- Add or replace existing government owned Standard Definition equipment with High Definition equipment that can provide both Standard Definition and High Definition Digital television through the existing Analog CATV Networks allowing the government to broadcast to existing non-digital ready televisions to allow the government to upgrade Digital ready televisions later, yet still delivering television services.

- The VA requires that the Contractor provide design, construction, installation, and all labor and materials to Upgrade all Standard Definition Receivers 480P to High Definition with 1080P SWM H25 receivers. install Blonder Tongue High Definition Digital Modulators through the existing government owned cables to provide television services in accordance with VA standards. The design must be approved by the VA before construction begins.

- The VA requires that the installation be completed within 15 days of the award of the contract.
- The subscribed TV signal shall be continuous, non-interrupted, with good viewing quality

on both Standard and High Definition televisions. Technical support by telephone shall be included at no additional cost to the Government.

- The VA shall provide the Contractor the receiver and card numbers necessary to startup services upon contract award.

Authorization must be obtained from the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) in advance for any work performed outside of normal working hours (after 4:00 p.m. and before 8:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, any Saturday, Sunday, or Federal holiday), to arrange for all services on this station. If this authorization is given for the convenience of the Contractor, there will be no additional charge for labor, travel time, or other expenses.

OVERTIME & HOLIDAY PAY: Any overtime and/or holiday pay that may be entitled to the Contractor's employees shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor and shall not be billed to nor reimbursed by the Government.

Contractor will bill and be paid for actual services provided by Contractor personnel. Contractor will not be paid for "availability" or "on-call" services unless otherwise provided herein.

8. CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL BACKGROUND REQUIREMENTS:

The Office of Security and Law Enforcement provides Department-wide policy on the assignment of appropriate position sensitivity designations associated with Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) positions involving national security and public trust responsibilities, and on the level of background investigations required for applicants for, and incumbents of, those positions. In addition to VA employees, the policy and investigative requirements are applicable to Contractor personnel who require access to VA computer systems designated as sensitive.

Personnel who require access to VA computer systems shall be subject to all necessary background investigations and receive a favorable adjudication from the VA Office of Security and Law Enforcement to ensure compliance with such policy. If such investigation has not been completed prior to contract commencement, the Contractor shall be responsible for the actions of those individuals performing under the contract.

Should the contract require Contractor personnel to maintain U.S. citizenship, the Contractor shall be responsible for compliance. Regardless of U.S. citizenship requirements, Contractor personnel are required to read, write, speak, and understand the English language, unless otherwise specified in this contract or agreed to by the Government.

The cost of such investigations shall be borne by the Contractor, either in advance or as reimbursement to the Government. The level of sensitivity shall be determined by the Government on the basis of the type of access required. The level of sensitivity will determine the depth of the investigation and the cost thereof. At this time, the current estimated costs for such investigations are as follows:

The Contractor shall be required to furnish all applicable employee information required to conduct the investigation, such as, but not limited to, the name, address, and social security number of Contractor personnel. The VA will provide all the necessary instructions and guidance for submission of the documents required to conduct the background investigation. Background investigations shall not be required for Contractor personnel who will not be required to access VA computer systems nor gain access to sensitive materials.

9. CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL:

The Contractor shall provide a contract program manager who shall be responsible for the performance of the work. The name of this person shall be designated in writing to the Contracting Officer. The Contractor's Program Manager shall have full authority to act for the Contractor on all contract matters relating to daily operation of this contract.

10. CONTRACTOR EMPLOYEES:

The Contractor shall not employ persons for work on this contract if such employee is identified to the Contractor as a potential threat to the health, safety, security, general well-being or operational mission of the installation and its population.

Contract Personnel shall be subject to the same quality assurance standards or exceed current recognized national standards as established by the Joint Commission (JC).

BADGE: Contractor shall obtain a "Contractor I.D Badge" from the VA Police. All Contractor personnel are required to wear I.D Badge during the entire time on VA facility. The I.D Badge ***MUST*** have an identification picture and shall state the name of the individual and the company represented.

PARKING: It is the responsibility of the contract personnel to park in the appropriate designated parking areas. Parking information is available from VA Police & Security Service Office. The Contractor assumes full responsibility for any parking violations. The VASNHS does not validate or make reimbursement for parking violations of the contractor's personnel.

SMOKING: Contractor personnel may smoke only in designated areas. It is the responsibility of the VISN 22 Healthcare Facilities to provide a safe and healthful environment for employees and patients and to serve as a leader in community health awareness and education. It is in fulfillment of this obligation that the facilities are committed to the establishment of a smoke-free environment. This policy applies to every location in the Healthcare Facilities. There shall be no smoking within 25 feet of all entrances to buildings. Smoking is allowed in all outside areas that are 25 feet away from entrances to buildings unless indicated otherwise. Enclosed patios connected to facility buildings are considered part of the building and as such are non-smoking areas.

ADP SECURITY: Protection of Computer Equipment, confidentiality of patient information, and the integrity of computer software/data at all Healthcare Facilities are essential. Software installed on each PC is copyrighted and copy of software for use elsewhere is prohibited. In the event of a possible security violation, the Healthcare Center's ADP Security Committee shall investigate and recommend corrective action to the appropriate agency.

11. INSURANCE COVERAGE:

The Contractor agrees to procure and maintain, while the contract is in effect, Workers Compensation and Employee's Public Liability Insurance in accordance with Federal and State of California and/or Nevada laws. The Contractor shall be responsible for all damage to property, which may be done by him, or any employee engaged in the performance of this contract.

The Government shall be held harmless against any or all loss, cost, damage, claim expense or liability whatsoever, because of accident or injury to persons or property of others occurring in the performance of this contract.

Before commencing work under this contract, the Contracting Officer shall require the Contractor to furnish certification from his/her insurance company indicating that the coverage specified by FAR 52.228-5 and per FAR Subpart 28.307-2 has been obtained and that it may not be changed or canceled without guaranteed thirty (30) day notice to the Contracting Officer.

Contractor is required to provide copies of proof of Workers Compensation and Employee Public Liability Insurance within fifteen (15) calendar days after notification of contract award.

The Contractor shall submit in arrears a properly completed itemized invoice in accordance with FAR clauses 52.212-4(g) Contract Terms and Conditions – Commercial Items via Tungsten Network, <http://www.tungsten-network.com/US/>.

Invoices submitted for payment shall be reviewed for accuracy and shall be subject to approval by the Government prior to issuance of payment.

No advance payments shall be authorized. Payment shall be made on a monthly arrears for services provided during the billing month in arrears in accordance with FAR 52.212-4, para. (i) Upon submission of a properly prepared invoice for prices stipulated in this contract for services delivered and accepted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract, less any deductions stipulated in this contract.

Payment of invoices may be delayed if the appropriate invoices as specified in the contract are not completed and submitted as required.

13. SECURITY:

The contractor shall ensure adequate LAN/Internet, data, information, and system security in accordance with VA standard operating procedures and standard contract language, conditions laws, and regulations. The contractor's firewall and web server shall meet or exceed the government minimum requirements for security. All government data shall be protected behind an approved firewall. D.3 52.209-7 INFORMATION REGARDING RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS (JUL 2013)

D.8 VAAR 852.219-10 VA NOTICE OF TOTAL SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESS SET-ASIDE (JUL 2016)(DEVIATION)

(a) *Definition.* For the Department of Veterans Affairs, "Service-disabled veteran-owned small business concern or SDVSOB":

(1) Means a small business concern:

(i) Not less than 51 percent of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more service-disabled veterans or eligible surviving spouses (see VAAR 802.201 Surviving Spouse definition);

(ii) The management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more service-disabled veterans (or eligible surviving spouses) or, in the case of a service-disabled veteran with permanent and severe disability, the spouse or permanent caregiver of such veteran;

(iii) The business meets Federal small business size standards for the applicable North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code identified in the solicitation document;

(iv) The business has been verified for ownership and control pursuant to 38 CFR 74 and is so listed in the Vendor Information Pages database, (<https://www.vip.vetbiz.gov>); and

(v) The business will comply with subcontracting limitations in 13 CFR 125.6, as applicable

(2) “Service-disabled veteran” means a veteran, as defined in 38 U.S.C. 101(2), with a disability that is service-connected, as defined in 38 U.S.C. 101(16).

(b) *General.*

(1) Offers are solicited only from verified service-disabled veteran-owned small business concerns. Offers received from concerns that are not verified service-disabled veteran-owned small business concerns shall not be considered.

(2) Any award resulting from this solicitation shall be made to a verified service-disabled veteran-owned small business concern.

(c) *Agreement.* A service-disabled veteran-owned small business concern agrees that in the performance of the contract, the concern will comply with the limitation on subcontracting requirements in 13 CFR §125.6.

(d) A joint venture may be considered a service-disabled veteran owned small business concern if the joint venture complies with the requirements in 13 CFR 125.15, provided that any reference therein to SDVO SBC is to be construed to apply to a VA verified SDVOSB as appropriate.

Purchases paid with a Government-wide commercial purchase card are considered to be an electronic transaction for purposes of this rule, and therefore no additional electronic invoice submission is required.

- (7) Provide all information establishing the timeliness of the protest.

(b) Failure to comply with the above may result in dismissal of the protest without further consideration.

(c) Bidders/offerors and contracting officers are encouraged to use alternative dispute resolution (ADR) procedures to resolve protests at any stage in the protest process. If ADR is used, the Department of Veterans Affairs will not furnish any documentation in an ADR proceeding beyond what is allowed by the Federal Acquisition Regulation.
