

COMBINED SYNOPSIS/SOLICITATION VA248-17-Q-1296

SERVICES: HCHV Contracted Emergency Residential Shelter (CERS) Beds

General Information

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial items prepared in accordance with the format in Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; proposals are being requested and a written solicitation will not be issued.

Solicitation number is VA248-17-Q-1296 and is issued as a Request for Quote (RFQ). This solicitation documents and incorporates provisions and clauses in effect through Federal Acquisition Circular 2005-94/95, effective 19 January 2017. This solicitation starts 08/16/2017 and will end 09/13/2017 at 12:00 pm EST.

Network Contracting Activity 8 – Service Area Office -East intends to award an Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) Requirements contract with Firm Fixed Price Contract Line Items for HCHV Contracted Emergency Residential Shelter (CERS) Beds for the Bay Pines Healthcare System. This procurement is being conducted under FAR Subpart 13 and simplified acquisition procedures apply. Period of performance is 28 September 2017 – 27 September 2018. The is a base year with four (4) one year options requirement. The North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS) code for this procurement is 624221 with a small business size standard of \$11 million.

For tiered evaluation purposes, to be considered as a Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) or Veteran Owned Small Business (VOSB), prospective offerors shall be a verified VOSB in the VA Center for Verification and Evaluation (CVE) Veteran Information Pages (VIP) pages <https://www.vip.vetbiz.gov/> at the date and time set for receipt of offers.

Set-Aside Requirements. The Government reserves the right to make no award from this solicitation.

Any award resulting from this solicitation will be made using the following cascade set-aside procedures per VHA memorandum #17-09, June 21, 2017

In compliance with 38 U.S.C. 8127

The evaluation of offers received in response to the solicitation will use a tiered or cascading order of precedence. “Tiered evaluation of offers,” also known as “cascading evaluation of offers,” is a procedure used in negotiated acquisitions when market research is inconclusive for justifying limiting competition to small business concerns or sub-categories of small business concerns. The contracting officer-

- (1) Solicits offers from both small and other than small business concerns that will be evaluated in the following tier order:
 - (a) Service-disabled veteran-owned small business (SDVOSB);
 - (b) Veteran-owned small business (VOSB);
 - (c) All other small business concerns.
 - (d) Other than small business.
- (2) If an award or a sufficient number of awards cannot be made at the first tier, evaluation of offers will proceed at the next lower tier until an award or a sufficient number of awards can be made.

date and time will be considered late in accordance with FAR Provision 52.212-1(f) and will not be evaluated unless the Contracting Officer determines the late quote will be accepted IAW 52.212-1(f)(2)(i)(A-C).

The Government will award a IDIQ Requirements contract resulting from this RFQ to the responsible contractor whose quote is determined to be Technically Acceptable and price reasonable in accordance with the evaluation criteria in this solicitation at FAR Provision 52.212-2. Award will be made utilizing the above cascade set-aside procedures.

SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

The contractor shall offer 24-hour supervised environment to include a clean, safe, home-like setting, semi-private or private room with bath access, communal dining with three meals/day and healthy snacks, laundry facilities on site including soaps, and a climate-controlled indoor recreational area for reading, writing, watching television, playing games, relaxing, and/or socializing. Estimated quantities are a maximum of 20 beds per day and/or minimum of 1 bed per day. **Contractors shall quote prices for all Contract Line Item Numbers:**

QUOTATION SUBMISSION

Offerors shall submit quotes electronically by the date and time in accordance with the Request for Quote instructions. Quote shall be no more than 5 megabytes or exceed the limits to be submitted electronically via email.

52.212-2 Evaluation-Commercial Items (JAN 1999)

The Government will award a firm fixed priced Requirements contract to the responsible offeror meeting or exceeding the technical criteria. Offeror shall demonstrate their ability to meet these factors with their offer in accordance with Paragraphs 1 - 3 below, and offers shall meet the minimum qualifications below in order to be evaluated. Technical and Pass Performance are significantly more important than price. Technical acceptability is rated based on the following:

I. Technical.

At a minimum, the offeror shall develop a plan showing an understanding of the tasks to be covered and the schedule for the required services as identified under section IV Scope of Work. The plan will at a minimum outline:

- 1) Management Plan outlining at a minimum (see IV. Scope of Work).
 - a. Treat Plan.
 - b. Transition Plan.
 - c. Substance Testing.
 - d. Face to Face 24/7 Well Fair checks.
 - e. Therapeutic and Rehabilitative Services.
 - f. Key Personnel Roster.
 - g. Draft outline of potential Corrective Action Plan as described in paragraph 19.
- 2) Offeror shall provide Personnel documentation at a minimum (see IV. Scope of work)
 - a. Certifications, Training and licenses of Key Personnel and daily staff.
 - b. Certifications and Training of Counselors, social workers, Healthcare Staff.

3) Offerors minimum Facility Requirements.

- a. As identified in paragraph 15; and provide documentation supporting compliance with items a-d.
- b. Veteran Transport Outlining availability as required in paragraph 20.

II. Past Performance.

Offerors shall provide a minimum of three (3) identified references when submitting their quote. Emphasis will be on recent, relevant past performance. Recent is defined as work performed within the last three years. Relevant is defined as work similar in size and scope of the work described in the Statement of Work (SOW).

III. Price.

(a) Any supplies and services to be furnished under this contract shall be ordered by issuance of delivery orders or task orders by the individuals or activities designated in the Schedule. Such orders may be issued from **29 Sep 2017 through 28 Sep 2022**.

(b) All delivery orders or task orders are subject to the terms and conditions of this contract. In the event of conflict between a delivery order or task order and this contract, the contract shall control.

(c) If mailed, a delivery order or task order is considered “issued” when the Government deposits the order in the mail. Orders may

be issued orally, by facsimile, or by electronic commerce methods only if authorized in the Schedule.

52.216-19 Order Limitation (Oct 1995)

(a) Minimum order. When the Government requires supplies or services covered by this contract in an amount of less than **1 bed per day**, the Government is not obligated to purchase, nor is the Contractor obligated to furnish, those supplies or services under the contract.

(b) Maximum order. The Contractor is not obligated to honor --

(1) Any order for a single item in excess of **20 beds daily**;

(2) Any order for a combination of items in excess of **20 beds daily**; or

(3) A series of orders from the same ordering office within 2 hours that together call for quantities exceeding the limitation in subparagraph (b)(1) or (2) of this section.

(c) If this is a requirements contract (i.e., includes the Requirements clause at subsection 52.216-21 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR)), the Government is not required to order a part of any one requirement from the Contractor if that requirement exceeds the maximum-order limitations in paragraph (b) of this section.

(d) Notwithstanding paragraphs (b) and (c) of this section, the Contractor shall honor any order exceeding the maximum order limitations in paragraph (b), unless that order (or orders) is returned to the ordering office within 10 days after issuance, with written notice stating the Contractor's intent not to ship the item (or items) called for and the reasons. (a) This is a requirements contract for the supplies or services specified, and effective for the period stated, in the Schedule. The quantities of supplies or services specified in the Schedule are estimates only and are not purchased by this contract. Except as

this contract may otherwise provide, if the Government's requirements do not result in orders in the quantities described as "estimated" or "maximum" in the Schedule, that fact shall not constitute the basis for an equitable price adjustment.

(b) Delivery or performance shall be made only as authorized by orders issued in accordance with the Ordering clause. Subject to any limitations in the Order Limitations clause or elsewhere in this contract, the Contractor shall furnish to the Government all supplies or services specified in the Schedule and called for by orders issued in accordance with the Ordering clause. The Government may issue orders requiring delivery to multiple destinations or performance at multiple locations.

(c) Except as this contract otherwise provides, the Government shall order from the Contractor all the supplies or services specified in the Schedule that are required to be purchased by the Government activity or activities specified in the Schedule.

(d) The Government is not required to purchase from the Contractor requirements in excess of any limit on total orders under this contract.

(e) If the Government urgently requires delivery of any quantity of an item before the earliest date that delivery may be specified under this contract, and if the Contractor will not accept an order providing for the accelerated delivery, the Government may acquire the urgently required goods or services from another source.

(f) Any order issued during the effective period of this contract and not completed within that period shall be completed by the Contractor within the time specified in the order. The contract shall govern the Contractor's and Government's rights and obligations with respect to that order to the same extent as if the order were completed during the contract's effective period; provided, that the Contractor shall not be required to make any deliveries under this contract after **28 Sep 2022**.

The Government may require continued performance of any services within the limits and at the rates specified in the contract.

These rates may be adjusted only as a result of revisions to prevailing labor rates provided by the Secretary of Labor.
