The needed Biochemical supply kits are specific to the BacT/ALERT 3D blood culture instrument that the Durham VAMC utilizes. The equipment is used to detect bacteria and fungi in the blood or other normally sterile body fluids (sepsis). Use of supplies not intended on the instrument would compromise the results of the tests and could potential lead to misdiagnosis and a critical delay in patient care.

4. DESCRIPTION OF MARKET RESEARCH CONDUCTED AND RESULTS OR STATEMENT WHY IT WAS NOT CONDUCTED:

GSA Advantage and GSA eBuy were searched to find out if needed supplies are on FSS contract. The BacT/ALERT 3D blood culture instrument is on FSS contract but the supplies are not. Initially a new cost-per-test for Blood Culture instrument and supplies was going to be initiated so a Sources Sought Notice (VA246-17-N-0227) was posted. The notice was posted on 7/1017 through 7/20/17 (10 days) and two vendors responded- Biomerieux and Becton Dickinson – both large businesses. Durham has asked that the longer-term contract for a new instrument be delayed to give time for Biomerieux's new generation analyzer to gain a performance track-record. VIP website was searched with NAICS code 325413 and keyword: "infection" and VIP listed no vendors. VIP also searched using NAICS code 325413 and keyword "bloodstream". No vendors listed.
