-- Project Scope --

GENERAL:

4. VA Medical Center Wilmington intends to issue a construction contract. The project consists of:

- a. The Contractor shall provide all labor, transportation, materials, equipment, and supervision required to perform removal and replacement on fire rated doors and door frame at the building 1, on the 5TH floor in front of the Eye Clinic at the Wilmington VA Healthcare System, located at 1601

Kirkwood HWY, Wilmington, Delaware 19805.

SPECIFICS:

5. BUILDING 1, 5TH floor, Eye Clinic.
 - a. Replace fire rated doors (90 minutes) and fire rated door frame located on the 5th floor corridor. The fire rated doors are located in a 1-hour fire wall at the entrance to the eye clinic.
 - b. Install new fire rated door frame in accordance with VA policy and guidance.
 - c. Install new fire rated doors (90 minutes) in accordance with VA policy and guidance. The fire rated door must have positive latching hardware. The fire rated doors both will swing open outward away from the entrance for the eye clinic.
 - d. Fire rated doors (90 minutes) will have a Lo Pro vision (ADA) and vision cut-out 7"X22" inches. The glass will be fire/impact safety glass with film.
 - e. Installing of doors mechanism which include positive latching hardware, vertical rod, level night latch-breakaway, lever dummy trim, standard full mortise hinge and electrical device power supply.
 - f. Fire rated doors (90 minutes) will have install a kick plate 8"X 34" inches.
 - g. Fire rated doors (90 minutes) will have mag locks install to keep doors opened during working hours. One mag lock holder will need to be relocated from inside the eye clinic to the outside. All holes left on the wall from the exiting mag lock holder will be cover, patch and painted. The mag locks will be connected to the fire alarm system.
 - h. The fire rated doors (90 minutes) will be able to be accessible by the card reader.
 - i. The card reader would have to be relocated to a new location. The whole were the old card reader will be patch up and painted. If from the junction box in ceiling to the card reader have loose wiring. The contractor would need to install conduit from the new location to the junction box and pull the wire through. Any wiring is to be inside electrical conduit and in accordance with VA policy and guidance. The mag locks will need to be integrated into the existing security system (The tri-M Group is the Value Added Retailer (VAR) designated for VAMC Wilmington, DE. Tri-M shall be hired by the contractor to perform all engineering, licensee fees, programing, integration into the existing security system, and system design documentation/as-built drawings.
 - j. All breaches through a fire wall must be sealed with the appropriate fire caulk material meeting VA policy and Guidance. A before and after picture will be taken of the area being breach.
 - k. Removal of the handrails and crash rail located on the outside of the eye clinic door. All holes will be cover, patch up and the wall will be painted.
 - l. Removal of the AED signed. Relocation to the adjacent wall above the AED. The old wall that the AED signed was hanging will need to be patch up and painted.
 - m. All area that are affected by this project will have a before construction, during construction and after construction picture taken.
6. Work to be scheduled to interfere as little as possible with normal VA operations.
7. Contractor responsible for patching and sealing all penetrations. Finish matching existing. In some instances, this may require painting corner to corner to prevent obvious patchwork.
8. VAMC Wilmington Notified Fire Alarm System is currently maintained by BFPE. All alterations to the existing fire alarm system are to be completed by BFPE as part of this contract.

Other Specifics:

9. Prime Contractor to plan all phasing of work in coordination with Hospital staff in order to minimize down-time to areas affected by the project.
10. Construction Waste Management, Specification 01 74 19 is to be included.
11. Prime Contractor to maintain all infection control/ dust prevention measures required.
12. Contractor will get all Permits Necessary to complete the project.
13. Consolidate all necessary submittals by specification section on an excel spreadsheet. Checklist to be utilized to track/ monitor submittal process.
14. Contractor will submit picture of affected area before, during, and after construction.

-- Site Investigation --

Expectation: Contractors will make site visits as necessary to survey existing conditions.

15. Make site visit as required to determine existing as-built conditions affecting this project.
 - a. Provide any structural, architectural, electrical, and mechanical investigation work including interior site work, of both existing and designed systems necessary to insure the accuracy of the design.
 - b. Provide any measured drawings of existing systems of facility required to insure the accuracy of the design.

-- Environmental/Occupational Safety and health (EOSH) --

Expectation: All projects and project designs shall contain language that addresses all applicable EOSH requirements.

-- Location/Hours/Deliverables --

Performance Location:

18. Building 1, 5TH floor in Front of the Eye Clinic at the VAMC Wilmington, Delaware located at 1601 Kirkwood HWY, Wilmington, DE 19805.

Hours:

19. Work is to be performed on Friday at 6:00PM -12:00AM, Saturday at 08:00AM-5:00PM and Sunday 08:00AM-5:00PM. Contractor access will be provide during this time, except special federal holidays.
20. The contractor will not have any personnel on site any other day without the proper approval from the COR.

Deliverables:

21. The Contractor will submit a daily log, pictures, work performed each time services is render.

-- Contractor Personnel and Management --

Contractor Personnel:

22. The Contractor shall be responsible for employing qualified personnel to perform the work specified in this SOW. The Contractor shall make sure that subcontractor and employees have proper documentation to authorize personnel to work in the United States of America. The Contractor shall maintain the personnel, organization and administrative control necessary to ensure that the work delivered meets the contract specifications and requirements.
23. The Contractor is required that all subcontractor or employees have been screen by the VAMC Wilmington Healthcare System. All personnel are required to wear a VA government furnished badge. All contractor and subcontractor are required to wear a government and company furnish badge while performing services under this contract. The badge will contain a personal picture, name of employee, and Contractor's name. Badges shall be worn on the outer garment attached to the outer shirt or jacket pocket by a button or clip or worn around the neck secured by an appropriate identification card lanyard.
24. Government issued identification badge remains the property of the Government and shall be returned to the issuing office or other designated Government personnel upon transfer of Contractor employees from the contract.
25. The contractor shall insure that employee or subcontractor have valid driver license when driving a vehicle on property.

Management:

26. All information generated in performance of this contract becomes property of the Government and must be surrendered upon request and/or completion of the contract. The Contractor must protect against the destruction and/or misplacement of all information produced under this contract, unless directed under local policy to destroy. This includes both hard and soft copies of data .
27. The Contractor shall not release any information (including photographs, files, public announcements, statements, denials, or confirmations) on any part of the subject matter of this contract or any phase of any program hereunder without the prior written approval of the COR .
28. Contractor personnel or subcontractor shall conduct themselves in a professional manner (i.e. timeliness, communication; spoken and written etc.). The Contracting Officer may require the Contractor to remove from the job site any employee working under this contract for reasons of suspected misconduct, a suspected security breach, or suspected to be under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any other incapacitating agent. Contractor employees shall be subject to dismissal from the premises upon determination by the Contracting Officer that such action is necessary in the interests of the Government. The hospital director or designated representative has the authority to bar individuals from the Government facility. The removal from the job site or dismissal from the premises shall not relieve the Contractor of the requirement to provide sufficient personnel to perform the services as required by this performance work statement. The Government shall not reimburse the Contractor for travel and other expenses associated with the removal of personnel.
29. Contractor personnel are not authorized to carry or possess personal weapons to include, but not limited to, firearms and knives with a blade length in excess of three inches, while assigned under this contract.

Safety/Security Requirements:

30. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and ensure performance is secure while protecting material, equipment, and supplies from damage and loss. The Contractor shall ensure that employees or subcontractor have the proper PPE for the job. Government security personnel shall have the express right to inspect for security violations at any time during the term of the contract.

Work Attire and Appearance:

31. Contractor personnel shall present a professional appearance commensurate with standards delineated for Government civilian personnel acting in similar capacities.

Personnel Qualification:

32. The Contractor shall be responsible for employing technically qualified personnel to perform the work specified in this SOW and authorized to work in the United States. The Contractor shall maintain the personnel, organization, and administrative control necessary to ensure that the work delivered meets the contract specifications and requirements. The work history of each contractor employee must contain experience directly related to the task and functions he/she is intended to perform under this contract. The Government reserves the right, during the life of the resulting contract, to request work histories on any contractor employee for the purposes of verifying compliance with the above requirements; additionally, the Government reserves the right to review resumes of contractor personnel proposed to be assigned. Personnel assigned to, or utilized by, the Contractor in performance of work shall be fully capable of performing the requirements contained in the SOW in an efficient, reliable, and professional manner.
33. Contractor shall provide a supervisor who speaks English on site at all time .
34. Personnel should be properly trained for safety and performance of their respective duties.
35. Appropriate safety equipment shall be furnished by the Contractor to contractor personnel or subcontractor and shall be used as prescribed by OSHA Standards.
36. The Government reserves the right to review Contractor personnel qualifications. Upon request, resume shall be provided to the Contracting Office prior to clearance approval, for review and acceptance by the COR. The intent is verification purpose and not for the Government to become the hiring authority.

Non-Personal Service Statement:

37. Contractor employees performing services under this order will be controlled, directed, and supervised at all times by management personnel of the contractor. Contractor management will ensure that employees properly comply with the performance work standards outlined in the SOW. Contractor employees will perform their duties independent of, and without the supervision of, any Government official. The tasks, duties, and responsibilities set forth in the contract may not be interpreted or implemented in any manner that results in any contractor employee creating or modifying Federal policy, obligating the appropriated funds of the United States Government, overseeing the work of Federal employees, providing direct personal services to any Federal employee, or otherwise violating the prohibitions set forth in Parts 7.5 and 37.1 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR). The Government will control access to the facility and will perform the inspection and acceptance of the completed work.

-- Damages/Insurance --

Damages:

38. The Contractor is liable for all damages to Government equipment, property; utilities, etc., located at the site (e.g. sprinkler heads, ceiling tiles, manholes, fire hydrants, vehicles, windows, etc.) caused by the Contractor, its employees or its subcontractors. The Contractor shall immediately report all damages to the COR and shall provide the Contracting Officer (CO) and COR, a written report, within 24 hrs. The report shall include: What occurred, who was involved, when it occurred (Time/Date), where did it occurred, why it occurred, how it occurred, and the proposed means to repair or replace.
39. Contractor is to maintain free and unobstructed access to facility emergency services and for fire, police and other emergency response forces in accordance with NFPA 241.
