Gray Market Equipment

- (a) Gray market items are Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM) goods sold through unauthorized channels in direct competition with authorized distributors. This procurement includes removing the old compressor and installing new OEM compressor as stated in the SOW, along with any ancillary replacements parts. No remanufactures or gray market items will be acceptable.
- (b) The contractor shall be an OEM, authorized dealer, authorized distributor or authorized reseller for the proposed compressor replacement as stated in the SOW along with any ancillary replacements parts. The Contractor shall provide an authorization letter or other documents from the OEM as verification along with OEM's warranty of services that will be provide by the OEM. All warranty and services contracts for maintenance shall be in accordance with the OEM terms and conditions.
- (c) The delivery of gray market items to the VA in the fulfillment of an order/award constitutes a breach of contract. Accordingly, the VA reserves the right enforce any of its contractual remedies. This includes termination of the contract or, solely at the VA's election, allowing the Vendor to replace, at no cost to the Government, any remanufactured or gray market item(s) delivered to a VA medical facility upon discovery of such items.

Background

Chiller #8, located on Floor 8, has failed. This chiller services the Operating Suite at the Oklahoma City VA Health Care System. The oil pump for the compressor on the second circuit failed. Since the oil pump is an integral part of the compressor, it cannot be replaced as an individual part. This compressor is specific to Carrier and other manufacturer parts are not compatible with the existing system.

The compressor is part of the Carrier Liquid Chiller model# 30HXA161RZE661KA/ SN 5105Q05873. The chiller is 80 tons using R134-a refrigerant.

Task required

The contractor shall be will responsible for removing the existing failed compressor and provide all the necessary resources and labor to order and Install a new compressor-model# 4905UO43526. In addition to the compressor installation, this task includes furnishing and installing/changing the following:

- 1 internal filter (new with replacement compressor);
- 1 external filter drier (Henry Technologies S-4004TA or equivalent), and Oil charge in separator (Inhibited polyolester based synthetic compressor lubricant for use in screw compressors, ISO Viscosity Grade 220) on Chiller #8. (*This may be inclusive with the new compressor-please confirm with manufacture*)

After the compressor installation, the contractor will be responsible for testing system for leaks and make the necessary repairs to correct the leaks associated with the installation.

The new compressor is to perform to its manufacturer design and intended purpose. The contractor will return the Chiller #8 to service when completed.

Constraints for this task

The contractor cannot use elevators or any lifts located on the OKC VAHCS campus for the compressor. Due to the location (Floor 8 Clinic Addition mechanical room).

Delivery and placement of the compressor on Floor 8 will be performed after hours (weekends and weekdays before 08:00 and after 16:30).

Section III will fully describe the operation of the equipment and shall include a listing of each control with a brief description of its function and step-by-step procedures for each operating mode. Procedures will use the control(s) nomenclature as it appears on the equipment and will be keyed to one or more illustrations of the equipment. Operating procedures will include any preoperational checks, calibration adjustments and operation tests. Notes, cautions and warnings shall be set off from the text body so they may easily be recognizable and will draw the attention of the reader. Illustrations should be used wherever possible depicting equipment connections for test, calibration, patient monitoring and measurements. For large, complex and/or highly versatile equipment capable of many operating modes and in other instances where the Operation Section is quite large, operational information may be bound separately in the form of an Operators Manual. The providing of a separate Operators manual does not relieve the supplier of his responsibility for providing the minimum acceptable maintenance data specified herein. When applicable, flow charts and narrative descriptions of software shall be provided. If programming is either built-in and/or user modifiable, a complete software listing shall be supplied. Equipment items with software packages shall also include diagnostic routines and sample outputs. Submission information shall be given in the Maintenance Section to identify equipment malfunctions that are software related.
- (f) Section IV, Principles of Operation. This section shall describe in narrative form the principles of operation of the equipment. Circuitry shall be discussed in sufficient detail to be understood by technicians and engineers who possess a working knowledge of electronics and a general familiarity with the overall application of the devices. The circuit descriptions should start at the overall equipment level and proceed to more detailed circuit descriptions. The overall description shall be keyed to a functional block diagram of the equipment. Circuit descriptions shall be keyed to schematic diagrams discussed in paragraph (i) below. It is recommended that for complex or special circuits, simplified schematics should be included in this section.
- (g) Section V, Maintenance. The maintenance section shall contain a list of recommended test equipment, special tools, preventive maintenance instructions and corrective information. The list of test equipment shall be that recommended by the manufacturer and shall be designated by manufacturer and model number. Special tools are those items not commercially available or those that are designed specifically for the equipment being supplied. Sufficient data will be provided to enable their purchase by the Department of Veterans Affairs. Preventive maintenance instructions shall consist of those recommended by the manufacturer to preclude unnecessary failures. Procedures and the recommended frequency of performance shall be included for visual inspection, cleaning, lubricating, mechanical adjustments and circuit calibration. Corrective maintenance shall consist of the

data necessary to troubleshoot and rectify a problem and shall include procedures for realigning and testing the equipment. Troubleshooting shall include either a list of test points with the applicable voltage levels or waveforms that would be present under a certain prescribed set of conditions, a troubleshooting chart listing the symptom, probable cause and remedy, or a narrative containing sufficient data to enable a test technician or electronics engineer to determine and locate the probable cause of malfunction. Data shall also be provided describing the preferred method of repairing or replacing discrete components mounted on printed circuit boards or located in areas where special steps must be followed to disassemble the equipment. Procedures shall be included to realign and test the equipment at the completion of repairs and to restore it to its original operating condition. FAR 52.212-2 Evaluation-Commercial Items (OCT 2014)

All quotes shall be evaluated under the guidance set forth under FAR Part 13. Hence, the Government is not obligated to determine a competitive range, conduct discussions with all contractors, solicit final revised quotes, and use other techniques associated with FAR Part 15. The contracting techniques associated with FAR Part 15 are not mandatory.

Therefore, all quotes will be comparative evaluated- An analysis of comparing each quotation with the other quotation received, to determine which one will provide the best benefit to the government.

Example of comparative evaluation

When (2) or more quotes are received, using the comparative evaluation; Contractor's "A" quotation will be compare with Contractor's "B" quotation and Contractor's "C" compare with "A" and "B" and so on. Similarities and differences are documented and an award will be made to the Contractor whose quotation, as "whole", offers the best benefit to the government.

The following areas will be use as guidance to compare each contractor with one another:

Experience changing out large tonnage compressor used in chiller applications.

- And how well a contractor performed on similar services for other government agency or company.
 - The Government reserve the right to review any resource for past performance, if deem necessary.
- o Price.
- Possession of the type of Mechanical License and applicable EPA certification for recovery of refrigerant.
