The action under consideration will result in a new Firm Fixed Price Task Order against an existing General Schedule Administration (GSA) contract.

## 4. Authority:

## 5. Rational/explanation to support cited authority:

An urgent and compelling need exists to address potential deficiencies at the VA Medical centers in VISN 9, that may not be in compliance with The Joint Commission (TJC) standards. The Joint Commission accredits and certifies more than 20,500 health care organizations and programs throughout the United States. It is anticipated that on or after October 1, 2018 the TJC will began an assessment of the medical centers in the VISN 9 network. Failure to expeditiously procure these services at the present could result in serious harm to the VA Medical Centers relative to their accredidation. FP&C Consultants, Inc. is a Life Safety and Fire Protection Engineering Consulting Firm whose capabilities involve projects containing all building types, including Assembly, Business, High-Rise, Residential, Industrial, Educational, Institutional and Special Hazards.
