STATEMENT OF WORK (SOW)

1. Introduction

The Department of Veteran Affairs (VA), Veteran Integrated Service Network (VISN) 22, Network Contracting Office (NCO) requires a Contractor to provide a Two-Day Introduction to Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP) and WRAP Facilitator Five-Day Certificate Course for the VA Greater Los Angeles Healthcare Systems (VAGLAHS).

2. Background

VA GLA has the largest and most complex Homeless program in country with over 16,000 Veterans served annually and about 600 staff. VA is committed to rapidly expanding training programs to assist staff members. There is on-going need to provide clinical training using empirically validated training Wellness Recovery Action Plan (WRAP.) The curriculum is designed to assist persons with mental illness and other issues obtain and maintain an optimal level of recovery.

3. Period of Performance

- a) The contract will be from August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019.
- b) This will be a Firm-Fixed Price (FFP) Contract.
- c) The Contractor shall complete all task and deliverables in the designated time frame.

4. Scope

The Contractor shall provide all necessary and appropriate labor, supervision, tools, materials, supplies, and equipment necessary to perform the services requested herein and in accordance to the Statement of Work (SOW). The Statement of Work outlines the tasks and responsibilities for the Contractor to be performed at the VAGLAHS located at 11301 Wilshire Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90873.

- a) **WRAP Introduction** -Through Participation in these workshops people will be able to:
Apply Key Concepts of Recovery into their everyday life to improve their quality of life. Identify tools and action plans to counter the negative effects of life challenges and improve responses to disturbing thoughts and feelings to achieve improved states of wellness. Describe the history, foundations and structure of the Wellness Recovery Action Plan.
 - 1) One two-day training:
 - 2) 15 staff members will participate in the training.
- b) **WRAP Facilitator Training** - participants to facilitate WRAP classes and equips them with the skills and materials to facilitate classes in their community and organization. It is for people who have completed a Seminar I WRAP course. The WRAP Facilitator training provides an experiential learning environment based on mutuality and self-determination. Participants in this course will be expected to participate in interactive learning activities and demonstrate their own experience with WRAP.
 - 1) Five-day training at the following facility:
 - 2) 15 staff will participate in the training.
- c) Contractor's Travel Expenses shall be included on the fixed price.
