

COMBINED SYNOPSIS/SOLICITATION 36C24819Q0005

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial items prepared in accordance with the format in Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; quotes are being requested and a written solicitation will not be issued.

Solicitation number is 36C24819Q0005 and is issued as a Request for Quote (RFQ). This solicitation documents and incorporates provisions and clauses in effect through Federal Acquisition Circular 2005-100, effective 22 Aug 2018. This solicitation starts 5 Sep 2018 and will end 20 Sep 2018 at 12:00 pm EST.

Network Contracting Activity 8 – Service Area Office - East intends to award a Firm Fixed Price service contract for Court Reporting Services for the North Florida/South Georgia Healthcare System. This procurement is being conducted under FAR Subpart 13 and simplified acquisition procedures apply. Period of performance is 1 Oct 2018 – 30 Sep 2019. There is a base year with four (4) one year options requirement. The North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS) code for this procurement is 561492 with a small business size standard of \$15 million.

This procurement is a TIERED Evaluation limited to Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) or Veteran Owned Small Business (VOSB): This solicitation is being issued as a tiered evaluation for SDVOSB concerns, or in alternative, as a tiered evaluation for VOSB concerns. If award cannot be made, the solicitation will be cancelled and the requirement resolicited.

This solicitation is Lowest Price Technically Acceptable (LPTA). Award will be made to the offeror determined to be technically acceptable; and price is determined to be reasonable; all eligible offerors may submit quotes. All offerors shall be registered in the System for Award Management (SAM) at <https://www.sam.gov> ; and www.vetbiz.va.gov , to be considered for

an award of a federal contract. The record shall be complete and not missing elements such as representations and certifications; and SDVOSB/VOSB shall be certified.

Prospective offerors shall be a registered in the System for Award Management (SAM) at <http://www.sam.gov> to be considered for an award of a federal contract, and registration shall be complete and not missing elements such as representations and certifications.

To be considered as a Service Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business (SDVOSB) or Veteran Owned Small Business (VOSB), prospective offerors shall be a verified SDVOSB/VOSB the Veteran Information Pages (VIP) pages <https://www.vip.vetbiz.va.gov/> at the date and time set for receipt of offers.

Quotes received after this date and time will be considered late in accordance with FAR Provision 52.212-1(f) and will not be evaluated unless the Contracting Officer determines the late quote will be accepted IAW 52.212-1(f)(2)(i)(A-C).

The Government will award a Firm Fixed-Price contract resulting from this RFQ to the responsible contractor whose quote is determined to be Lowest Price Technically Acceptable and price reasonable in accordance with the evaluation criteria in this solicitation at FAR Provision 52.212-2.

SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

The North Florida/South Georgia Malcom Randall VMAC requires Court Reporter Services as described in the attached Performance Work Statement (PWS). The contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, parts, supervisions, services and incidentals to perform Court Reporter services. Work shall be completed as estimated and required in the PWS. All offerors shall quote prices for each Contract Line Item Numbers (CLIN) for a Base year and 4 one-year options. Estimated 13-15 proceedings per year. **See Attached Price Schedule for quote submission**

QUOTATION SUBMISSION

Offerors shall submit quotes electronically by the date and time in accordance with the Request for Quote instructions. Quote shall be no more than 5 megabytes or exceed the limits to be submitted electronically via email.

The Government will award a firm fixed priced contract to the responsible offeror determined to be the Lowest Price Technically acceptable; and price is determined to be reasonable. Offerors shall demonstrate their ability to meet these factors with their offer in accordance with Paragraphs I – III below, and offers shall meet the minimum qualifications below in order to be evaluated. Technical acceptability is rated based on a GO or NO GO basis for ALL factors and sub-factors. At a minimum the following shall be provide with each quote:

I. Technical

- A. Management Plan. At a minimum, the offeror shall develop and submit a plan showing an understanding of the tasks to be covered and the schedule for the required services as identified in the attached Performance Work Statement (PWS). The submitted plan shall at a minimum outline:

- 1) Contingency Plans for weather or other unforeseen interruptions of service.
- 2) Plan to meet VA Training Management System (TMS) training requirements (see PWS 1.5); and certificate submission for completed training.
- 3) Plan to provide the reviews and quality checks required to ensure reporting, recording, transcripts and photocopying conform to acceptable government standards.
- 4) List of equipment to be use for contract performance.
- 5) Plan for delivery of hearing deliverables, transcripts, notes, as described in the PWS.

B. Personnel. At a minimum, the offeror shall provide the credentials for personnel assigned to perform the required services as identified in the attached Performance Work Statement (PWS). Appropriate credentials shall be provided within one (1) week upon request. The offeror shall submit at a minimum the following:

- 1) Provide List of Key Personnel
- 2) Provide Resume
- 3) Provide training certificates for court reporting equipment or Company Certification Memorandum stating the personnel are trained on all equipment required to perform the requirements of the PWS.
- 4) Provide certificate(s) for National Court Reports Association (NCRA) Registered Professional Reporter (RPR), or equivalent (determination of equivalency at the discretion of VAMC) or Company Certification Memorandum stating the personnel are certified.

II. Past Performance

Offerors shall provide a minimum of three (3) identified references when submitting their quote. Emphasis will be on recent, relevant past performance. Recent is defined as work performed within the last three years. Relevant is defined as work similar in size and scope of the work described in the Performance Work Statement (PWS).

The Government may require continued performance of any services within the limits and at the rates specified in the contract. These rates may be adjusted only as a result of revisions to prevailing labor rates provided by the Secretary of Labor. The option provision may be exercised more than once, but the total extension of performance hereunder shall not exceed 6 months. The Contracting Officer may exercise the option by written notice to the Contractor within 14 days of contract expiration.
